
ABOUT THE FOLEY GET-TOGETHERS ...

SUMMER 1981

If you are not registered for camp, what are you going to do this summer? Are you going to watch television play a few sports, hang around the playground, stay in the house, or see the same old friends? Why don't you take a break from this and spend a few weeks where the fun and action is at Camp Foley?

There are plenty of things to do at Foley including sailing, waterskiing, canoeing, boating, fishing, swimming, camping trips, horseback riding, riflery, archery, fencing, skeet shooting, golfing, tennis, soccer, team sports, sailing races, tennis tournaments, special days and square dancing. It is your opportunity to advance in your skill or to learn something you might never have a chance to learn again. These skills remain with you many years and make it easier for you to lead an active life.

Activities are not all Foley has to offer. Foley helps you to meet new friends all around the country, friends to write to, friends to visit and friends to know. Many people tell us every year how they are keeping in touch with people they met at camp even back to 19401

Take the opportunity while you have it and sign up for Camp Foley, where the summer fun begins.

When this time of the year comes and the ice begins to melt, I want to put a sailboat in the water and tune up for the spring racing season. However, in Minnesota, snow and cold weather can be common in March so the sailboat stays in storage until April.

As I enter my seventh season as head sailing instructor at Camp Foley, I look back at how much I have learned over the years teaching campers and staff how to sail and race. I look back at the four years of sailing while I

was at Marquette University; racing against other college students on Lake Michigan, traveling throughout the Midwest, and three times on the east coast. I have plenty of experience, but I want more experience. I want to know even more about the sport. I continually strive to race better. Sailing is not like running,

you get better with age. Most of the top sailors in the country are over thirty years old. If you are interested in sailing or racing, Camp Foley has everything you need: good sailboats, a solid program with instruction from beginning sailing to advance racing techniques and the opportunity to advance in your sailing skills to your upmost potential. When the "wind is up" Foley sailors are "hiked out", keeping the boat on a "plane" going as fast as possible.

SUMMER REM NDERS AND HELPFUL HINTS



Being prepared for camp can make a camper's experience more enjoyable and fun. This can be achieved by bringing the necessary items from home. In addition to the clothing list that you have or will receive with the medical form, the following items may be most useful at camp:

LIFEJACKET: Every camper needs a U.S. Coast Guard Approved Lifejacket.

GAMES, STATIONARY: There will be times when a camper needs to relax by himself/herself or with the cabin group. Send some good books, card games like O'No 99, Uno, etc., backgarmon, or small electronic games, pencils, pens, paper, envelopes, and stamps to write letters (pre-addressed for younger campers are most helpful).

SAILING - RACING: A stopwatch or a watch with a minute hand is an absolute necessity if the camper has his/her Camp Foley Seaman or above and is interested in racing in intercamp regattas or Whitefish Chain Yacht Club Regattas.

FISHING: A small compact drop line, complete with hook, weights, and bobber that would fit into a duffle bag would be very useful for the young camper who would like to relax and drop a line into the water.

TENNIS PLAYERS: Bring your racket, balls, and tennis shoes.

HORSEBACK RIDERS: Bring your hard sole boots or shoes - a safety factor for riders.

INSECT REPELLENT (non aersol) AND FLASHLIGHTS: These items are considered by some campers a necessity. If your child feels he needs these items, please send them with him/her.

SPECIAL DAY - UMGAWA: During each session campers and staff will be dressing up as Indians. Pack a costume or a gunny sack or some old material to make a costume. Information on Indian history, legends, songs, or dances would also be most helpful.

***Please note: Some of these items are for sale at the camp store at minimum quanities, styles, brands, etc. for the camper who "forgot". Help keep your camper's expenses at a minimum and send the necessary items. Visit with your child about buying unnecessary items.

ABOUT SIGN UP ...

CAMPERS, upon arrival at camp, you will be signing up for 5 activities which you will be taking for 3 days after which you may sign up again. Take a moment and think about the first activities you would like to take. REMEMBER ONLY FIVE ACTIVITIES PER SIGN UP.






