This will be an exciting year at Foley as a special emphasis is being placed on the older camper in the evenings, activities and special days to meet their needs and interests. The Sioux Tribe, composed of 13 to 16 year olds will even find some of the rules different than those for the younger campers, allowing for personal growth, more responsibility and fun. LATE NIGHT ADVENTURE


Once a session, the Sioux campers (13 to 16 year olds) may elect to participate in the Late Night Adventure. This event will begin in the evening and go through until about 2:00 AM followed by a sleep-in and cabin time until noon. Campers participating will plan their Late Night Adventure which may include a dance, ping-pong tournament, board games, videos, pizza, a swim and sauna, etc.

CAMPER LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Sixteen and seventeen year olds who have been campers at Foley in the past are invited to apply. This program formerly known as Work Crew, gives campers an excellent opportunity to gain experiences and skills as part of their training to be a counselor. Two four week programs are offered. Please contact us for additional information.

DISHWASHERS

This coming summer fifteen year olds can do dishes once per day and work off \$50.00 per week of their camp tuition. It is an excellent way to enjoy the activities and friendships while gaining work experience. It is limited to 6 dishwashers at any one time. One may come to camp at the the scheduled sessions or with the CLPs for a four week session. If you are interested, contact Marie.



ADVANCED LIFESAVING

Campers must be 15 years old and meet the following swimming requirements: swim continuously for 500 yards, do a standing front dive with reasonable form, swim underwater 20 feet and tread water for one minute. Classes will run for 3 weeks. All participants in the Camper Leadership Program will be required to take this course. PLEASE NOTE that to participate a camper needs to be regisitered for either Session IA or Session II & III (course starts in the middle of Session II).



LAKE SUPERIOR SAIL TRIP

Plans are being made during First and Second Session to charter a large boat for a 4 day cruise on Lake Superior. Campers will explore the Apostle Islands and learn the skills of large yacht sailing. Cost will be between \$250-\$300 which covers boat charter, food and transportation. This cost excludes regular Session I and II tuition and personal expenses of the camper throughout the trip.

Any camper 13 years of age or older who has some sailing experience is eligible for the sail trip. If you are interested in participating in the sail trip, please contact us.


A PAJAMA BREAKFAST will add a little morning fun as campers and staff

Junior Camp

Junior Camp is a specially designed program for 6 and 7 year olds who want to participate in a fun filled week at Foley. Each junior camper will receive a camp t'shirt, stamped postcard to send home, certificates of accomplishments, candy and pop from the camp store and art and shop supplies as part of their tuition fee. The only extra expenses would be transportation to and from camp and additional items purchased at the camp store.

This year we are also introducing the Exposure Award. This is an award unique to the junior campers. It gives campers the opportunity to try new and different activities during their stay at Foley. Activities may include outdoor environmental skills, compass courses, mini-firebuilding for marshmellow roasts, camping skills and much more!

Introduction To Camping

Our Introduction to Camping Program is offered to campers ages 8-16, who have never been to Foley. Campers are invited to spend one week with us living in a cabin with other first year campers, choosing their own activities, developing friendships and being a part of the fun and excitement of longer term campers. This is an excellent opportunity for children to gain a general, short term camping experience.

Introduction to Camping offers campers the opporunity to choose six activities every three days. These activities could include art, shop, tennis, archery, riflery, all-terrain biking, nature programs, soccer, sailing, boardsailing, canoeing, waterskiing, swimming, diving and much

nore.

New FUN for 1989!

Hey campers! As most of you know, we are always trying to bring some new, fun and crazy ideas to camp every summer. This year is no exception! Marie and Jeff explored several ideas while attending the American Camping Association conference in Seattle.

TIPIS

Not one, but two genuine Sioux-styled, canvas tipis were purchased for our new Indian Village. These cone shaped structures measure 18 and 20 feet in diameter and stretch 16 to 18 feet into the air. The unique design of this is, to say the least, remarkable! Campers will be able to experience some of the life of an Indian Youth while sleeping, eating and playing in this quaint setting.

PUSHBALLS

A pushball is a huge 48" diameter ball that can be pushed, thrown or kicked. Light in weight, this ball will help develop coordination, team concepts and endurance. The pushball will be exciting as a free-swim, evening or Sunday activity! This giant ball can even be used instead of a soccer ball or just passed around from person to person.

RHYTHM-STICKS

What is a Rhythm-stick? It is an activity that involves the passing back and forth of a main stick between two hand held sticks. Once you have mastered the basic passing of the stick you can move on to advanced tricks such as twirls, flips or tosses! The technique of using the Rhythm-sticks is similar to juggling in that it develops hand-eye coordination. The Rhythm-sticks will be available for the campers to practice with during their free time and exhibitions will be scheduled for the campers to display their developed talents!

INDIACA

Pronounced "Indy-a-ka", it resembles a huge badminton shuttlecock or birdie. The soft, foam birdie is coated and has real feathers. Played over a volleyball net, players hit the Indiaca with their hands. It travels slow enough to be easily hit by anyone. According to Colleen Garrett and Jeff Beltz it was a riot to play with! Whether you like volleyball or not, you will love Indiaca!





















FROM MARIE'S DESK
