



Lake Superior Sail Trip

Camp Foley will be offering two Lake Superior Sail Trips during the three week session. Participants in the three day sail trip will learn to safely erew and skipper a deep water cruising sailboat, a 42' ketch. Campers will be responsible for rigging and unrigging the boat, spending time at the helm as skipper, participating in dinghy launching and landing, and sharing in galley duties.

In addition to the sailing, campers will explore some of the 22 Apostle Islands. These islands are rich in history and wildlife. Known for their hiking trails, lighthouses, and secluded wildlife habitat, the islands provide campers an unique opportunity to experience the beauty and history of a truly extraordinary part of our world.

Any camper, age thirteen or older, who has some sailing experience can participate in this special program. Cost will be \$265.00.

Plans call for our trippers to spend three days biking some incredible trails that lead to some spectacular waterfalls, touring Split Rock Lighthouse, camping along Lake Superior in some breathtaking campsites, and visiting a multitude of state parks in the area. We are also researching the possibility of participating in one of the following: sea kayaking on Lake Superior, an alpine slide, or a whitewater rafting trip. Our adventurous campers will celebrate their accomplishments with a stop off in Duluth for a pizza lunch before returning to camp.

After Camp BWCA Trip

Every Foley camper knows that one of the toughest challenges facing them is having to select between the wide array of camp activities. When it comes to tripping, it becomes even more difficult to choose between all of the daily happenings in camp and the many wonderful benefits and lifetime experiences an extended trip can offer.

In response to our campers, Foley is offering two new wilderness trips, one for boys and one for girls. Each nine day, Boundary Waters Canoe Area or B.W.C.A., trip will depart following the close of camp on August 16 to August 25. There will be seven campers and two staff on each trip.



Each trip promises to be a fun filled adventure. You'll explore one of our nation's most pristine wilderness areas, fish its abundant waters, swim in crystal clear lakes, learn to prepare gournet meals in the out of doors and acquire orienteering skills enabling you to navigate on your own. Share in an experience that will find you ending each day beneath a majestic sunset. Relax around a campfire and gaze at the spectacular northern lights. Catch a glimpse of the many constellations more clearly visible in the wilderness. A great sense of accomplishment and memories like these will last you a lifetime. All this and more awaits you. Sign up now!

To qualify for this trip, campers must have passed Camp Foley's Basic Canoe Award, have intermediate swimming skills, be between the ages of fourteen and seventeen, have the physical ability to paddle six hours a day, and assist in portaging equipment. Trip conditioning and preparation will be offered for campers lacking or wanting to sharpen their skills in the two week preceding session, from August 3 to August 16. Participants should be aware that there are some additional equipment needs for this trip. A complete list of this equipment and more information about this trip is available upon request. Cost for the trip is \$550.00 per camper. Camp transportation between Our Lady of Grace parking lot or the airport in Minneapolis on August 16 and August 25 can be arranged.

Congratulations to Mike Monge, the only recipient of a <u>Gold Paddle</u> during the 1993 Season. This is the highest honor that an individual thirteen years of age and over can earn at Camp Foley. In order to receive this award, one must master skills in a minimum of seven major activity areas. In addition, he or she must display strong positive characteristics such as leadership skills, respectfulness, and enthusiasm for the camp program. Mike attended camp the last two sessions and received his award during an Australian rendition of a trivia game at the final banquet. Mike first attended camp in 1986 at the age of nine years and progressed through Foley's leadership program. He was a CLP last summer. The


Scholarship Program

Tripping Overview

Camp Foley has traditionally offered canoe trips enabling campers to experience an overnight camping trip in a wilderness setting. In past years, trips up to 14 days would explore the vast wilderness areas of the Quetico and B.W.C.A. (Boundary Waters Canoe Area). When talking to many of our alumni, it is obvious that these extended trips were the highlights of their camping experiences and left the greatest lasting impressions.

This past summer, we branched out and added backpacking to the tripping program. Backpacking was an overwhelming success. Many campers completed the three day progression which included learning what to bring on a trip, how to properly fit and pack backpacks, proper clothing to wear, how and where to safely hike, and of course, hiking! The third day was spent day hiking with packs in the Chippewa National Forest. Campers felt it was hard work but worth the effort. They were proud of their accomplishments, especially when trails took them to pristine lakes not easily accessed by those unwilling to travel on foot. Some adventurous campers completed the next phase of the program and went on an overnight trip to Itasca State Park, the headwaters of the Mississippi River, Suomi Hills Recreation Area, or Barnum Lake.

During the summer, a bike trailer was completed to transport ten mountain bikes and camping equipment. This provides campers with more opportunities to bike away from camp. Two day trips were accomplished during the last session and it is predicted that the trailer will be on the move more in '94! We continue to encourage off road, on trail biking, utilizing the hundreds of miles of state and national forests, and logging roads in our area.

Canoe trips continue to be popular and numerous cabin groups paddled to Tepee Island or Big Island for an overnight experience. A group of girls took a one week trip to Voyageurs National Park and returned to camp with new skills, pride, and self fulfillment. We look forward to more tripping in '94!



How Do We Provide Campers With The Opportunities To Make Friends?

One of the most frequently asked questions from parents of prospective campers is "Will my child be okay if he/she isn't coming to camp with a friend?" Yes! Every session many campers do venture to Foley without a friend for many different reasons. Foley will assist parents in arranging for children to meet, write or call another camper by providing phone numbers and addresses. Prior to opening day, careful attention is given to composing cabin groups. One important consideration is creating a blend of campers conducive to formulating new friends. On the bus campers are introduced to others who are of similar age and many times to their cabinmates. Cabin counselors personally welcome each camper upon arrival to camp and introduce them to their cabinmates. The first day is spent as a cabin unit getting acquainted and acclimated to camp life. Each cabin participates in a variety of events actively involving the entire cabin. Cabin groups work together with their counselors on conflict resolutions utilizing a positive "Cabin Meeting" approach. Campers participate in an evening program stressing respect, acceptance and cooperation among all members of the group. Many camp events foster friendship building including: camp banquets, friendship campfires, autograph signing and all camp activities.

What are the Counselor Qualifications?

Throughout the years, Camp Foley has maintained a reputation for quality staff. This tradition of caring, talented and enthusiastic counselors has not been by accident. When we choose our staff, we are selecting adults who will be positive role models for young people. We personally have to be able to answer "yes" to the following question, "Would I trust this person with my own child in the camp environment?" Before we hire a prospective staff member, they have: completed an application, had three reference forms completed by former employers or instructors which attests to their character, completed a standardized personal interview, been assessed on their communication skills, personality, self-image, interpersonal skills, values, maturity and intellect, and been found to have the initial knowledge, experience and abilities to instruct at least two activities taught at camp.

When a staff member signs a contract, he or she signs a commitment to the values and philosophy of Camp Foley. Each staff member completes an intensive training program at Camp Foley before the campers arrive. This 10 or 11 day session is one of the longest training periods in comparison to other camps. Our staff actively rehearse all emergency procedures, attend seminars on discipline, sexual abuse, age characteristics of campers, cabin living, health and safety, program planning, and the philosophy, goals and objectives of Camp Foley. Our four full time directors continuously evaluate and support each staff member through morning staff meetings and personal evaluations of their instruction in activities and work in the cabin group.

What About Airline Transportation?

When a camper flies to the Minneapolis/St. Paul Airport, they are greeted at their arrival gate by a Foley staff member. Every camper calls their parent or guardian to inform them of their safe arrival. Foley staff provide supervision in the airport, introduce new campers, collect airline tickets, help with luggage and assist campers onto chartered, camp supervised motor coach buses.

Should you wish to arrange airline travel with our agent, Sheila Sigel, contact TRAVEL ONE at 1-800-245-1111. Sheila is currently researching the many anticipated price wars that should provide substantial savings on summer fares. It is not too early to give her a call with your travel plans. A manifest will be provided to Camp Foley with the names and flight times of all campers utilizing their service. When more than one camper travels from the same city, Travel One makes every effort to arrange the

same flight for those children. Specific seating assignments may also be requested.

Are The Camp Facilities Available For Use By Other Groups?

Foley's warm hospitality awaits family reunions, retreats or other special interest groups. Weekends in May, the couple of weeks in early June or late August and the month of September are ideal times to schedule the use of Foley's facility. Foley provides meals, lodging and program assistance. Contact the camp office for further information on availability, cost and reservations.

Is Camp Foley Accredited By Any Organization?

"Parents expect their children to attend accredited schools. They also deserve a camp experience that is reviewed and accredited by an expert, independent organization," stated Dr. Margery Scanlin, Director of the American Camping Association's Standards program. Scanlin continues, "By being ACA accredited, Camp Foley demonstrates that they care about their campers and comply with the highest quality standards designed specifically for camps."

We hope you will enjoy Foley's setting on the prestigious Whitefish Lake, the land and water activities, campfires, songs, and the other special events. Program

Step into the quiet and peaceful north woods and select the activities that interest you or choose to relax in camp's beautiful setting. Foley's fun loving and caring staff will assist you at a variety of activities from pulling skiers to skippering sailboats. Foley's talented staff will enrich your days and evenings with songs, stories, group games, and special events.

Each day, Foley staff will assist you at archery, boardsailing, canoeing, fishing, riflery, sailing, swimming, and waterskiing, providing equipment, direction, and safety management. A play group for younger children will be staffed each morning, allowing parents an opportunity to attend activities not suited for children under six. Beyond play group, the four days are designed for families to attend activities together. A family may register to attend Family Camp from lunch on Wednesday, August 17 to breakfast on Sunday, August 21 opting to stay from two to four days. The rate per day is \$45.00 per person or \$150.00 for all four days. Children between three and five are \$30.00 per day or \$100.00 for all four days. Those age two and under are free. Weather



August in Minnesota means sunny weather, warm lakes, lush grass on Foley green, the call of a loon, a glimpse of an eagle, clear skies, and northern lights. It can also mean cool evenings just right for settling down around a blazing campfire. August's average daytime temperature is 80 degrees with evening temperatures of 60 degrees.

Location/Directions

Camp Foley is located on the north shore of Whitefish Lake in North Central Minnesota, 180 miles north of Minneapolis and St. Paul. Whitefish Lake is a beautiful 4000 acre lake of crystal clear water with a sandy bottom. It is one of 22 lakes on the chain. Foley's forested lakeshore site of 100 acres with 1000 feet of shoreline, is abundant with plant and animal life. This enchanting site creates an ideal setting for a dynamic family camping experience.

Directions to Camp Foley from Brainerd, MN: Highway 371 north to the town of Jenkins. Turn right on "North White-fish Road" or County #15. Proceed 5.5 miles to County #1, turn right and follow #1 for 5.4 miles to County #134. Turn right and follow road for 3 miles to camp.

Just to Let You Know

We ask that you are considerate of the following policies. Participant assumes all of the ordinary risks normally inherent to the nature of the activities and events to be conducted and agrees that neither Camp Foley nor any of its directors or staff conducting such activities shall be responsible for any damages or injuries resulting to participant in the absence of evidence of gross negligence.

Any medical costs incurred on behalf of participant shall be the sole responsibility of participant and/or his/her parent or legal guardian.

Participant consents to the taking and use of any slides, photographs or videotaping during the program, whether for advertising, promotion and publicity purposes by Camp Foley and waives all claims for any compensation for such use or for damage. Participant agrees to having its name, address, and phone number printed for use in Family Camp or for future references.

Each participant is expected to handle himself or herself in a reasonable and responsible manner. A parent or legal guardian has sole responsibility of all minor children including, but not limited to their supervision and conduct.

Participant agrees to follow any rules and regulations established by Camp Foley to safely operate its program or to ensure the well being of its participants.





How is swimming tested?

Learning to swim is a valuable lifetime skill and safety on the water is a primary concern both at camp and throughout one's lifetime. Because campers typically spend at least half of their day at camp on or near the lake, testing gives us the security of knowing if they have the strength and composure to handle themselves in an emergency situation. Providing swimming instruction has two other benefits; it enhances the child's ability and helps improve their coordination. For these reasons, we test campers to either pass them out of swimming lessons or place them in the appropriate class according to their skill level.

In order for a camper to test out of swim lessons, they must possess American Red Cross Level 5 or intermediate swimming skills. The first part of the swim test will include a lifejacket check, watercraft safety information and a five minute interval of treading water to evaluate endurance. The second part is a stroke check. There are five strokes that will be tested; the front crawl, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, breaststroke, and back crawl. In order for a camper to pass out of swim lessons, they must complete the five minute tread and be able to demonstrate complete proficiency in three out of the five strokes. Campers must also show adequate ability in the other two strokes.

All campers who have been to Foley in the past and have passed the intermediate skills test will not be required to retake the stroke check. Everyone else who has not completed that level of swimming at Camp Foley, both new and returning campers, will be tested. Notes from swim coaches and copies of certifications from other aquatic facilities will be taken into consideration when evaluating camper's swimming abilities. We encourage parents to send copies of awarded certifications to the camp office before the camper arrives. This prevents the originals from getting lost or damaged.

Travel Arrangements

Parents choosing to make their own flight arrangements rather than using our agent, Sheila Sigel of Travel One (1-800-245-1111) may book flights on any airline so that arrival into the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Airport is before 10:00 a.m. on the opening day of the session and departure is after 2:00 p.m. on the last day of the session. If you are making your own flight arrangements it is extremely important that you notify camp of the pertinent information as soon as you have it.

Parents interested in using the bus transportation from Our Lady of Grace in Minneapolis can look for the information that will be forthcoming later this spring.

REGISTRATION - Fill in the application form, mail it in the enclosed envelope together with the \$300.00 registration fee. This is not an extra, but is credited to the camper's account. If a camper cancels prior to April 1, \$250.00 of the \$300.00 registration fee will be refunded. A \$50.00 service fee will be charged. The application fee is not transferable to other campers.

EARLY REGISTRATION NOTES - When registering prior to November 15, the camper enrolling will receive a free white Camp Foley T'shirt with nautical flags in addition to the \$30.00 per week discount. Shirts will be given to campers throughout the winter at Foley Get-Togethers held in local communities.

TUITION AND EXTRAS ARE PAYABLE IN ADVANCE - Parents will be billed for tuition, transportation, and the extra expense deposit for the canteen or camp store at least four weeks prior to the beginning of the session. Payment is due two weeks prior to the camper's arrival at camp. Late fees will be charged at 1.5% per month. In September,

a final bill will be mailed to the parent for an adjustment of the account. Tuition will not be refunded if the camper leaves prior to the expiration of his enrollment, except for personal medical reasons, but not including dismissal for disciplinary reasons. No refund is made for late arrival or early departure. The tuition fee covers the full program with the following exceptions: Bedding Rental - Blankets and pillows are available to foreign campers at \$15.00 for length of stay.

TRANSPORTATION - Parents are invited to bring their children to camp but are encouraged to send them on our special buses as an aid to their camp adjustment.

• At the beginning of the sessions on Wednesdays, June 22, June 29, July 20, and August 3, our buses leave Our Lady of Grace Church parking lot. 5051 Eden Ave., Edina, at 10:30 a.m.

- At the end of the sessions on Tuesdays, June 28, July 19, August 2 and August 16, our buses from camp will arrive at Our Lady of Grace Church parking lot in Edina at approximately 12:30 p.m. If your son or daughter is to travel on our bus, merely indicate your desire in the space provided on the application form.

- Camp will coordinate flights to the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Airport. Special flight information will be sent as soon as the summer of 199⁴ schedules are available, however, parents may book flights on any airlines so that arrival in Minneapolis is before 10:00 a.m. and departure is after 2:00 p.m. Campers will be met as flights arrive and will be bused directly to camp. If necessary, supervised lodging can be arranged. We shall also provide a corresponding return service. Please use the tuggage tags that will be sent to help identify Foley luggage. Use of duffle bags is requested. We assume no liability until the camper is under our supervision or after the camper leaves our supervision en route home.

HEALTH - Physical forms and health history forms are mailed upon receipt of registration. Physicals must be completed and signed by a licensed physician within 24 months of camp attendance. Anyone coming to camp without a medical form properly filled out will be charged accordingly for an examination by a local physician. (A photocopy of the camper's current school medical examination will be acceptable.) All health histories must be completed yearly within 6 months of camp attendance. Campers will be limited in their activities until this form is properly completed.

- A resident nurse is available to meet camper needs. The nurse will dispense only FDA medications that are in the original, labeled containers. Medical attention is available in Pine River and Brainerd.

- Parents are responsible for all expenses incurred by illness/accident of camper. Camp Foley does not carry individual camper medical insurance. This includes cost of transportation for medical reasons.

ACTIVITIES - Campers of all ages and abilities can participate in the major activities such as sailing, canoeing, swimming, archery, tennis, nature studies, soccer, group games, fishing, shop, and art. To participate in the following activities one must meet these minimum requirements:

All-terrain biking - tall enough to ride a 26" bike safely. Boardsailing - Level 4 (Advanced Beginner) swimming skills, and strength to pull up the sail. Diving - Level 4 (Advanced Beginner) swimming skills. Riflery - Eight years of age or older. Snorkeling - Level 4 (Advanced Beginner) swimming skills. Trap Shooting - Twelve years of age or older. Waterskiing - Level 5 (Intremediate) swimming skills.

All activities are progressive and challenge both the beginner and advanced camper.

Swimming Lessons are required through Level 5 unless a parent makes other arrangements. Intermediate skills include swimming 50 yards of front crawl, elementary back stroke, breast stroke, side stroke, back crawl, survival float, treading water and diving. Endurance is also considered.

CAMP FOLEY assumes no liability for loss or damage to campers' personal property or for injury incurred as a result of use of personal property. Foley discourages all borrowing and lending among anyone living or working in camp. Campers may never use "special personal equipment" owned by other campers or staff such as: watercraft, skis, bows, rifles, musical instruments, aquatic equipment, or other items that are associated with specific risks (health, financial, accidents, etc.).

A list of names, addresses, and phone numbers of campers and staff will be printed for campers' use. Pictures are taken and used in camp promotion and fun mailings throughout the year. Upon request, your child can be excluded.

Personal property left by campers will be returned only upon request by parents, and at their expense. Expensive items when found and clearly marked, are returned.

Any money or valuables in the campers' possession upon arrival at camp may be deposited at the office for safe keeping. The camp assumes no responsibility for funds or valuables not so deposited.

Campers will be held responsible for damage to property and equipment caused by their negligence and will be charged accordingly for repairs or replacement.

We reserve the right to dismiss any camper whose conduct is harmful to the camp. It is understood and agreed, by camp and parents, that possession or use of tobacco, alcohol, or controlled substances while enrolled in camp can bring immediate dismissal.
