Preparing Yourself for Camp

Here are some hints and suggestions to prepare and empower yourself for your experience at Foley:

•Not a strong swimmer or a little rusty? Take some lessons or practice before coming to camp to increase your endurance and familiarity with a variety of strokes. Remember that swimming in a lake is different than swimming in a pool!

•Spend a night or two at a friend's house. Pretend that you are off to camp and pack your own bags and only call home if there is an emergency.

•If you don't already do these tasks, take the initiative to make your own bed, pick up and put away your own clothes, brush your teeth, wash and comb your hair. etc...

•Practice the "camp bedtime routine" of using your flashlight to read, write, draw. and/or listen to your Discman quietly for up to 15 minutes before falling to sleep.

•Practice having "rest period". a ½ hour quiet time after lunch where campers are on their beds. Campers are generally found reading, drawing with markers, playing card games or brain teasers, writing letters, beading, doing work puzzles, etc... (Electronic games are not an option.) Put together a rest period kit of fun things to do!

•Make a letter writing packet. Include pre-addressed stamped envelopes, pencil/pen, paper, etc.

•Practice making new friends - talk about how to do this with specifics:

-Smile and say "hello"

-Ask them to walk with you

-Ask them to sit by you

-Move over to include them

-Ask them questions about themselves: Where are you from? What are your favorite activities?

First Day of Camp – What Happens?

You're excited. You're scared. Your stomach has butterflies and your head is swamped with questions. Will I make a friend? What cabin will I be in? Who will be my counselors? When do I get to pick my activities? When do we eat?!? Wow! You sound just like the rest of our Foley campers! Did you know that kids come to Foley in a variety of ways? Many of our campers fly. The majority rides our special busses. Some arrive by car. And a few even come by boat!

Here's what happens if you fly to the Minneapolis/St. Paul Airport:

•Our counselors will meet you at your arrival gate. You'll

have a chance to call home to let your family know of your safe arrival and then it's off to get your luggage and load up the bus. As soon as all the campers have arrived, you're on your way to camp!

Here's what happens if you are riding the bus to camp:

•Everybody meets at Our Lady of Grace Church in Edina, MN. Boarding begins at 10:00 a.m. and by 10:30 a.m. the bus is on it's way to Foley!

What do you do on the bus ride to camp?

•Meet some of the counselors and campers.

•Start making new friends.

•Begin learning and singing some of the favorite camp sonas.

Eat a yummy bag-type lunch.Play games.Have FUN!

What happens when you get to camp?

•All campers arrive to a chorus of cheers and welcome from staff.

•Meet your cabin counselors who will take you to your cabin and help you find your assigned bunk.

•Meet your cabin mates! Start getting to know them! •Start unpacking and begin to settle in.

What happens after that?

Along with your cabin counselor and cabin mates, you will

•Take a tour of camp

•Meet the camp nurse

•Take the Foley Safety and Endurance Swim Check. This check lets us know what type of swimmer you are. For the check, you'll jump in the water with your lifejacket on and then swim 25 yards. We need to make sure your lifejacket fits you right! After that you'll jump back into the water without your lifejacket and tread water for 5 minutes. After a rest, campers swim 50 yards using the front crawl or breaststroke.

•Sign up and create an activity schedule for the next 3 days

•Play games

•Dinner is at 6:00p.m.

What happens after we eat?

•Everyone is off with their cabin groups to learn more about each other, play games, and finish settling in.

•After that it's the Opening Campfire! It is a fun time as our counselors entertain you with funny skits and tricks and goofy songs.

•Our younger cabins have lights out at 9:30 p.m. and our older cabins are soon to follow at 10:15 p.m.

Highlights 2003 Foley on a Fly

New to Camp Foley this summer was the amazing sport of fly-fishing. Fly-fishing is a sport and an art form that is arousing the curiosity of many people. Technically it is different from all other forms of fishing because it is the weight of the line that carries your offering to the fish and not the weight of the offering itself. Camp purchased six new fly rods, reels and fly tying vices in June to start an exciting new activity with fantastic potential. Campers had the opportunity to sign up for fly-fishing as an activity and for a trip.

In the Third Session there were nearly thirty campers who signed up for fly-fishing. There was so much interest that three activity periods were scheduled and eighteen lucky campers were able to participate. The first class of the sign up began with a brief introduction to fly-fishing and a lesson on fly-tying. Each camper had his or her own vice and all eighteen campers tied their first wooly buggers. On the second day, the campers practiced the art of fly-casting without hooks on Foley green. On day three, we brought the rods down to the lake to fish off either the dock or the pontoon boat. The pinnacle of the new fly-fishers' experience was their trip to the Pine River.

Three groups hopped into the van on Sunday and Todd Hiller, Foley's own high performance tripping driver, drove the groups to Staircase Landing on the Pine River. This peaceful landing led us down to the tranguil stream to what we like to call the "honey hole." This group landed nearly twenty fish during their short two hour excursion, their first experience fly-fishing in a river.
