

Some of them are wards of the state, being raised by a grandparent, from low income families struggling to make ends meet, or from needy families seeking opportunities to provide their kids with positive alternatives to inner city gangs, drugs, rural isolation and/or other challenges. Foley is committed, as are you, to providing positive camping experiences that aid to build an individual's self-esteem and skills, and build relationships with persons who serve as positive role models in both peers and adults.

Our goal for 2008 donations is \$8000.00 (scholarship dollars plus canteen balance to scholarship program). We are hoping to see an increase in donations so we will be able to continue to offer the Foley experience to as many deserving applicants as possible. Thank you in advance for your continued support of this program!

Partnering with Parents!

The Promise

This summer, promise your child . . .

New experiences, growth, fun, and caring. The special moments of childhood that provide those learning experiences come from many sources. The unique experience that is camp gives children all of those things—and more.

An opportunity to be independent and learn resiliency. Many parents have understandable worries and concerns about their children growing up in today's world. Those worries become counterproductive, though, when they get in the way of children's experiences in taking healthy risks. Camp offers the chance for them to take those risks in a structured, nurturing community of professionals who can guide children on a journey of self-awareness and self-reliance.

A memorable life experience that can increase self-confidence. At camp, children are exposed to new experiences that can create "aha!" moments. "I can do this!" "I'm good at this!" "I thought this would be hard, but it wasn't so bad." "I guess it's OK to try something new." Exploration and discovery are key elements of the camp experience.



It has been 3 years since we have had a full session going on over the 4th of July and we are excited to get back to **celebrating Foley style!** We are going






Hall of Fame

Frequently Asked Alumni Questions!

Every year we spend time answering some of the same questions over and over for our Alumni. Although much of camp has remained the same, some things have had to change as the expectations of our campers and staff change. Here are some of the most frequently asked questions and their answers.

Are the cabin names the same? Yes! The boys are sleeping in the East end of camp going from youngest to oldest in Mandan, Kewaskum, Kadigomeg, Shingwako, Kildare, Seneca, Ojibway, Mingo and Wahtassa. The girls sleep on the West end starting in Yakama, Ishtakaba, Micmac, Sacajawea (part of Micmac, used to be Micmac II), Menominee (originally named Moorman and housed support staff), Pocahontas and Matoaka (originally the Wilderness Post where trips were packed out), Hiawatha and Tekawitha (originally where the Catholic Sisters lived when cooking for camp. Hiawatha used to be Tek II.)

Do you still tell the story of Big Red? No! Times have changed and we no longer tell scary stories.

Do you still have campers from Mexico? Yes! In 2008 we had 55 campers from Mexico; 3 from Italy, 6 from Sweden, 4 from Japan, 4 from France, 2 from United Arab Emirates, and 1 from England. We generally also have two or three international staff.

Do you still have all camp campfires? Yes! We have an Opening Campfire filled with stories, songs and skits and the Closing Campfire or Awards Campfire. Counselors are still using their imaginations to create lasting memories. We also have a Friendship Campfire that has been a tradition since the 70s.

Do you still send cabin groups out on the Voyageur (houseboat) or to the Tipi? No! For a different twist we have 2 sets of tree houses where campers spend the

night with their cabin mates.

Do you still eat soda bread on Sunday morning? Yes! We are still making those delicious buttermilk pancakes from scratch too.

Do you still play Reveille every morning to wake up the campers? No! When an electrical storm took out the PA system in the late 80s we did not replace it and returned to creating a more peaceful environment without 15 or so "bugles" going off throughout the day. Counselors use their creativity in waking the campers up every day and the campers manage to get to their activities.

Does the bell still ring for meals? Yes!

Is there still Saturday night boxing? No! There is a climbing tower where the boxing ring was originally located.

Do the campers still get to choose their activities? Yes! The number of activities has expanded! Check out www.campfoley.com to see all of the choices.

Do you still put a red ribbon around the neck of campers who cannot swim? No! Campers and staff now have to wear lifejackets when they are in boats so the need to know who can swim way out in the middle of the lake is less necessary. Kids are still tested on their swimming and take swimming lessons if they do not pass the swim check.



We will have special 85th anniversary stuff for saie through our camp store this year! We haven't made a decision on whether we are going to do clothing or other items, but please check the website for more information in February.




Tour & Lunch
