

2020 Craft Instructors

Each bolded project category is a sign-up for our campers and generally they will attend for three consecutive days, 1 hour each day. Each class will have campers varying in age from 8 to 16 and a variety of skill level and your goal is to challenge each camper and to be competent in what you are instructing.

You have been hired to **coach** and **guide** in the creating of finished pieces that a camper is proud to take home or to gift to a parent, sibling or friend. **Creativity** involves using materials available to you and googling the overwhelming number of samples and suggestions on how to accomplish a piece. Experiencing the craft makes you a better teacher!

Task 1: Do tasks **one project where highlighted 1 -5** and text 218-330-8105 or email marie@campfoley.com photos of your masterpieces. Thinking of creativity, a finished product, use of supplies, and clean-up. You are to be ready to instruct in these assigned projects.

Task 2: With the ones **not** highlighted, **Projects 6-9**, do some googling and researching so that you are ready to teach

Task 3: On arrival day, **turn in your samples** – these will become part of “crafts” and not kept for yourself. Please turn all unused supplies into the office at this time.

Project 1: CD Weaving or CD Dream Catcher

1. **Make one CD weaving or CD dream catcher**
 - a. Yarn and CD sent to you (may use other yarn if you have some as well)

Project 2: Salt Dough Crafts

1. **Make a batch of Salt Dough**
 - a. 2 cups of plain flour
 - b. 1 cup of salt
 - c. Up to 1cup of water (add the water in slowly as you may need less
 - d. Knead the mixture into a dough, if it is too sticky add some more flour
2. **Make three different finished pieces**
 - a. One animal
 - b. One bowl
 - c. Other – magnet, tea light holder, ornament

- Preheat oven to 250 degrees F (120 degrees C). Form **dough** into desired shapes and arrange on a baking sheet. **Bake** in the preheated oven until dry and hard, about 2 hours.
- Paint with Acrylic Paint and coat with Modge Podge (may do this when at camp)

 - a. Jute and a key ring will be sent to you, you may use other materials. (Thicker jute than I would normally use but we would like to use up what we own – be creative!)
 - b. Use the **magazine beads** that you made

3. **Lego coaster, toothbrush or pencil holder, or box**





