

Change, Change and More Change

In our world, and even in the camping industry, so much has changed in the last 100 years. But what is at the core of Camp Foley that has NOT changed? It is inspiring and gratifying to know that Foley continues to deliver a program with high ideals that speak to the campers of 2020. Our name of Camp Foley, while under our founder, Fr. John Foley, changed from Camp St. Thomas to Father Foley's Camp in the 1920's and later to Camp Foley in 1945. The first girls came to Foley in 1974, therefore the language in the early days was all boys, brothers and men. Enjoy the language of the 1920's with the quotes coming from the 1920's brochures.



Camp Foley has always been proud of...

- 1. Its continuous location on the shores of Whitefish Lake, stressing the importance of being outside in this beautiful environment and learning about the wildlife. 1920's "Far removed from the heat and excitement of the busy city, it gives freedom to ramble among the pines, dabble in the refreshing waters of unsurpassed lakes, learn something of the feathered, furred and finny tribes and, incidentally, grasp the variety and beauty of scenery for which Minnesota with its 10 thousand lakes is known."
- 2. Having a way to allow campers to have a choice in their daily activities. 1920's "Experience teaches us that if boys are given an opportunity to have a voice in arranging their day's program it encourages more interest in these activities."
- 3. **Having a family atmosphere.** 1920's "The family atmosphere is maintained. Each camper is treated as a brother. The boys are in residence but a few hours when they realize this at-ease and hominess of camp life."
- 4. **An awards system recognizing individual growth in activities.** 1920's "Boys who show considerable improvement in aquatic and field events are awarded a camp monogram at the close of the season."
- 5. **An enrollment for campers ages 8 to 16.** 1920's "Boys between the ages of 8 to 16 are desired. They must be of sound character and normal physical condition."
- 6. "Cabin Time" in the evenings when the campers and counselors gather together before going to bed to discuss their day, dreams, and thoughts in a supportive and caring environment. 1920's "It is during these evenings that the camper is given the opportunity to give expression to his innermost thoughts. Given the privilege to discuss any of his boyish dreams, and surrounded by an attentive audience he is instilled with confidence which makes for an ease of conversation, and self confidence in expression."
- 7. A focus on developing long lasting friendships that are carried into adulthood. 1920's "Here it is that the boys make friendships which carry them through life, where they come to an understanding of each other's problems in a manner that no other opportunity affords."
- 8. A progressiveness of providing equipment and programming to meet the needs of its campers. 1920's "All of the conveniences for a well-organized camp are provided. Row boats with outboard motors, canoes, diving docks, athletic equipment for all games are in constant use."

History at Camp Foley

When Father Foley first established his Catholic camp for boys, he named the cabins after the Native American tribes, people and places in Minnesota and the Midwest. Despite things that may have changed over the years, we still keep that tradition alive. We realize the names of these buildings have a much greater meaning and have been around for much longer than 96 years. Our goal is to show the important history behind these names and help campers understand why they are still significant today. Our 18 cabins are each named after a different Native American tribe, person, or legend. Campers are about to find out who's who and what's what and hopefully will leave with a better appreciation of the Native American heritage that is part of the history of Foley.

Best piece of advice given to me: My dad once told me "If you are working, you might as well be working hard."



Unward to 2021!

If 2020 was the year of the unexpected, then 2021 may be the year of the adaptation and anticipation. The year to think outside the box. To go above and beyond. The year of creativity and innovation. The year to do what we can the same and to change what we can't. Luckily, these are things we strive for every year. The problems may be new, but the process we take to get to solutions, is exactly the same.

Sometimes, before bed, campers do Rose, Bud, Thorn as a way to debrief our day at camp. Rose - what was your favorite part of the day? Bud - what are you looking forward to tomorrow? Thorn - what did you not like about your day? We are focusing on the "Thorns of 2020" and how to make them in to "Buds for 2021".

Thorn: Kids have been interacting with technology more than ever.

Bud: Camp will allow kids time to disconnect from technology, to have interactions, that are in person in a mostly outdoor setting, with other campers and staff. We promise an experience steeped in nature and investigation of the natural world. We will swap out zoom calls with the spray of water on your face while waterskiing or sailing. The smell the computer makes when it is a little too hot with the smell of the grass after it rains or soda bread cooking. The feeling of winning (or in my case losing) a video game with the sweet feeling of success when you release an arrow and hit a bullseye or make it to the top of the climbing wall for the first time. We will trade out the nerves of whether your face looks good on a video camera with making sure you have enough face paint on your face to cheer on your Alpha Games team. The goose bumps you get when you read bad news with the goose bumps you get when you listen to campers or staff read their 10 year essays. Camp will provide all of that (and more) in 2021.





Thorn: Kids have not been able to spend quality time with their peers. **Bud:** Camp will allow kids to **be around their peers** and near peers (camp counselors), on a regular basis for three weeks straight. Yes, some of that time may look different than years past, but sitting on the benches outside making bracelets or talking, and laying on the grass with other kids nearby for hours on end is possible. So is cheering on friends as they investigate new skills and create "Foley Firsts" at activities. Interaction in a safe, smart way is our top priority and will continue to drive the decisions we make on how to make our program work for 2021.

Thorn: Life has been put on pause, everyone is treading water, and kids haven't spent time away from home.

Bud: Grow grit. Investigate Independence. It has been our motto for awhile and we continue to believe in the power of camp

to create safe spaces for kids to practice growing up. There is nowhere better to allow kids to hit PLAY again (in more ways than one) than camp. Yes, we will still have do some literal water treading (swim checks!) but our goal is to push forward and allow kids to work on their physical and emotional skills. Practice making decisions, even if they are small (what to get for canteen, what activities to sign up for, relationships to build) in a smart, safe environment. Growing every day for three weeks while they investigate and practice their independence.





We don't have all the an-

swers. We don't know exactly what every activity is going to look like or how each meal will be served. We are still educating ourselves. Still stretching our creativity and innovation. There is however, one thing we are certain about - we are going to be working hard to deliver on all of these "Buds" and more!




