# Summer Highlights

### Leadership Program


The LIT and CIT program got guite the change this past year. The program now focuses on preparing participants to be successful independent leaders both inside and outside of camp. The program was split into three

categories, personal growth skills, life skills, and professional skills. This year participants learned about a variety of topics, such as: different leadership styles, how to be a team player, personal finance skills, writing a resume and cover letter, job interview skills, laundry, home maintenance, and the CITs spent an hour learning about car maintenance (how to change a tire, check oil, etc.). 


