Junior Lifequard Class


We are happy to announce that we will be able to give some of our campers the opportunity to become Junior Lifeguards! One of our first-year



When we got word that the Galbraith family was looking to sell their land, it was important to us to preserve Hidden Lake as a place to bring children in the future. We were fortunate enough to be able to acquire this pristine land that includes nearly 100 acres and 1,200 feet of shoreline on Whitefish Lake. If you have never been to Hidden Lake, it is a small body of water surrounded by a beautiful pine tree forest and separated from Whitefish Lake by a small bank. 


Schmid Family Update
